Non-credit Alignment</b>  <b>Brad Morrison</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Brad shared definitions of non-credit for Home Economics; will change name to Family and Consumer Science</li> <li>• There is a potential for growth in the non credit area of FCS</li> <li>• Need definitions of non-credit vs. credit, not for credit, adult education, community service and contract education</li> <li>• Courses have to be submitted through the Chancellor’s office for course approval; Short term vocational education will be required to submit a program comparable to review for credit programs;</li> <li>• Reimbursement for non credit courses is approximately 50% of credit courses</li> <li>• Salary for non-credit faculty varies from college to college depending on the collective bargaining agreements</li> <li>• 30% of community college students take a non-credit course; students are more successful if they combine credit and non credit courses</li> <li>• All stand alone courses have to be approved by Chancellor’s office</li> <li>• Recommendation is that a program would need 288 hours to be designated a program; there is no requirement for course hours</li> <li>• There is a lot of confusion over the</li> </ul>	<p>SB 361 is addressing funding issues but not in FCS;</p> <p>Joann recommended that a definition of non-credit be included in the documents along with the criteria</p> <p>Brad will send curriculum for all students to Susan for distribution to committee and response</p>
